Members of the Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) Working Party who took on the responsibility for the daily opening/closing of the MUGA, maintenance & bookings for this refurbished and newly reopened facility. 5. Volunteers of the Community Café who donated £1,500 towards the replacement bridge at Venn Ottery, bought the power sweeper and drag mat for the MUGA surface and paid for the repairs to the War Memorial which had been irreverently damaged by children.
